EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: On February 15, 2004, a fire consumed two commercial buildings in the

downtown area of Sparta, Georgia. The fire damage left these structures in a perilous situation posing a potential safety hazard to the adjoining properties and to State Route 15, a state highway owned and maintained by the Georgia

Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS: Said fire did cause major damage resulting in a weakened external wall

structure capable of possible collapse on to the travel way of State Route 15;

and

WHEREAS: The assistance of the State of Georgia is necessary for the benefit of the social

and economic welfare of the City of Sparta and to insure the safety to the

motoring public on State Route 15; and

WHEREAS: In light of this crisis and in conjunction with the authority vested in the

Governor by virtue of Article 3, Section 38-3-22, of the Georgia Emergency Act of 1981, as amended, to promulgate reasonable orders, rules and regulations as are deemed necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare, and to bring the emergency situation under control within the

acknowledged limitations of the powers of the Governor of this State.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN

ME AS THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS

HEREBY

ORDERED: That a State of Emergency exists in the City of Sparta in relation to the

damage to the structure located adjacent to State Route 15.

IT IS FURTHER

ORDERED: That all resources of the State of Georgia be made available to assist in the

response and recovery necessary to re-establish safe traffic movement on

State Route 15 in the City of Sparta.
