EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS:

As a result of the impact and damages of the severe storms and extensive flooding in the State of Tennessee, specific authorization to lift certain restrictions for commercial trucks, tanker trucks, other types of motor vehicles is warranted; and

WHEREAS:

In order to allow the movement of vehicles transporting the following emergency relief and support items: fuel; temporary housing; water; equipment; supplies; and communications equipment will need to be distributed by commercial motor vehicles in order to meet demand normally supplied by Gulf Coast Operations; and

WHEREAS:

Authorization of the Georgia Department of Transportation to issue permits accommodating the movement of vehicles and loads as stated above with coordination and cooperation from law enforcement of the Georgia Department of Public Safety Motor Carrier Compliance Division is warranted.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Georgia, it is hereby

ORDERED:

That travel is allowed during daylight hours only beginning thirty (30) minutes after sunrise and ending thirty (30) minutes before sunset for weight not to exceed a total gross weight of 95,000 pounds on five (5) weight-bearing axles; 13' 6" in height; 14' in width; and 100' in length for any such vehicle on roadways maintained by the State of Georgia.

(A) Transporters are responsible for ensuring they have proper permits in accordance with Georgia Department of Transportation Rules and Regulations (GDOT Rule 672-2-.06 and 672-2-.07).

(B) Permits may be issued by the Georgia Department of Transportation, Oversize Permit Unit, during normal business hours from 7:00 a.m. to 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday by calling 1-800-570-5428.

This Executive Order shall be valid from May 1, 2010 through July 1, 2010, or whenever the crisis has abated, whichever is soonest.
