



# THE STATE OF GEORGIA

## EXECUTIVE ORDER

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BY THE GOVERNOR:

**WHEREAS:**

The General Assembly passed House Bill 1054 during the 2008 Legislative Session, which created the Governor's Office for Children and Families, an attached agency to the Office of the Governor by consolidating the Children and Youth Coordinating Council (DJJ) with the Children's Trust Fund Commission (DHR). House Bill 1054 also renamed the Office of Child Advocate as Child Advocate for the Protection of Children and placed the Georgia Child Fatality Review Panel (DHR) as an attached agency to the Governor's Office under the supervision of the Child Advocate for the Protection of Children:

The General Assembly passed House Bill 990, the Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2009, during the 2008 Legislative Session, which appropriated \$7,291,902 in state general funds, \$389,692 in other funds, and \$2,336,481 in federal funds for the Children's Trust Fund Commission; \$2,796,879 in state general funds and \$4,869,756 in federal funds for the Children and Youth Coordinating Council; and \$379,815 in state general funds and \$72,534 in federal funds for the Georgia Child Fatality Review Panel.

**NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY**

**ORDERED:**

That as of July 1, 2008, the Children's Trust Fund Commission will transfer \$7,291,902 in state general funds, \$389,692 in other funds, and \$2,336,481 in federal funds, 4 positions and associated equipment to the Governor's Office for Children and Families. As of July 1, 2008, the Children and Youth Coordinating Council will transfer \$2,796,879 in state general funds, \$4,869,756 in federal funds, 4 positions,

1 motor vehicle and associated equipment to the Governor's Office for Children and Families, and 1 position to the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget.

**IT IS FURTHER**

**ORDERED:**

As of July 1, 2008, the Georgia Child Fatality Review Panel will transfer \$379,815 in state general funds, \$72,534 in federal funds, 3 positions, and associated equipment to the Child Advocate for the Protection of Children.
