## EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: Pursuant to O. C. G. A. § 42-9-9.1, law enforcement powers may be conferred upon and exercised by any person employed by the Board of Pardons and Paroles and otherwise certified as a peace officer; and

WHEREAS: Such law enforcement powers may be conferred upon the issuance of an Executive Order by the Governor and the consent of the majority of the members of the State Board of Pardons and Paroles;

WHEREAS: Certified employees of the Board of Pardons and Paroles are participating in security for the G-8 Summit,

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: The Board of Pardons and Paroles is hereby authorized to confer to employees participating in security for the G-8 Summit, during the period from May 24, 2004 through June 20, 2004, all powers of a law enforcement officer of this state, including, but not limited to, the power to make arrests for violations of any of the criminal laws of this state.

IT IS FURTHER

ORDERED: The law enforcement powers conferred upon the employees of the Board of Pardons and Paroles shall only be exercised in the counties of Chatham, Bryan, Liberty, McIntosh, Glynn and Camden and in a manner consistent with the G-8 Public Safety Command and Unified Command as set for the in the Governor's Executive Order dated May 7, 2004.
