EXECUTIVE ORDER


BY THE GOVERNOR:

- WHEREAS: The presence of Hurricane Ivan continues to pose a threat of significant wind and flood damage and related evacuations and sheltering activities;
- WHEREAS: The potential stress of the foregoing creates opportunities for price-gouging, fraud and consumer abuse; and
- WHEREAS: The assistance of the government of the State of Georgia is necessary to protect the public health, preserve the safety of the public, keep property damage to a minimum and to restore the social and economic welfare of the impacted counties;

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

- ORDERED: That the State of Emergency previously declared on September 1, 2004, extended to September 7, 2004 and extended again to September 15, 2004 for the State of Georgia be and is hereby further extended for a period of an additional five days until midnight on September 20, 2004 or until the end of an additional period of time as may be authorized by further Executive Order.
