EXECUTIVE ORDER


BY THE GOVERNOR:

- WHEREAS: On February 27, 2001, at 214 Gordon Street, Thomson, Georgia, the body of Ms. Robin Reeves was discovered with multiple stab wounds; and
- WHEREAS: On March 19, 2001, Governor Roy Barnes issued an Executive Order authorizing a reward in the amount of \$3,000.00 for the arrest and conviction of the individual/s responsible for this crime; and
- WHEREAS: The Thomson Police Department and the Georgia Bureau of Investigation have not been able to generate any significant suspects or information that would lead to an arrest; and
- WHEREAS: Section 45-12-36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotation provides that the Governor of the State of Georgia is authorized, in his discretion, to offer, and cause to be paid a reward for information leading to the identification, apprehension, and conviction of a person who has committed the crime of murder or voluntary manslaughter, where the victim of such a crime was a law enforcement officer acting in the line of duty at the time of the commission of such crime.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

- ORDERED: That a reward in the amount of \$2,000.00 bringing the total amount to \$5,000.00 is hereby offered for information leading to the identification, arrest, and conviction of the individual/s responsible for the murder of Robin Reeves
