Alliance Française; and

WHEREAS: The strong relationship between the State of Georgia and French-speaking

nations and regions of the world has brought economic growth and enhanced the lives of the citizens of our state as well as the citizens of

these countries; and

WHEREAS: French is the first language of over 105 million people worldwide, and

throughout the world, an additional 82 million people are learning to

speak French; and

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia takes pride and pleasure in joining the Francophone

community in a celebration of its French heritage, and commends La Francophonie for actively promoting peace, democracy and human rights throughout the world, especially those who have chosen to defend the

innocent from terrorists; now

THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

March 20, 2005, as FRANCOPHONIE DAY in Georgia.
