- WHEREAS: Physicians in these three specialties are committed to the attainment of optimal physical health, mental health, social health and well-being for all Georgians and serve as primary care physicians for Georgia's citizens; and
- WHEREAS: Primary care physicians are thus vital to the healthcare infrastructure of the state and quality of life in our state; and
- WHEREAS: Primary care physicians play uniquely important roles in keeping our citizens healthy and are dedicated to helping their patients and have advocated effectively for public policy measures that help sustain and improve the health of Georgia's citizens; now
- THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim February 10, 2005, as PRIMARY CARE PHYSICIANS' APPRECIATION DAY in Georgia.
