- WHEREAS: Americans of Irish heritage have lived in the United States since the 17th century, and Irish culture has played an integral role in the development of Georgia's character and identity; and
- WHEREAS: The Irish were the largest European group to inhabit the thirteen colonies in the 75 years leading to the 1776 Revolution and played a significant role in the War for Independence. Irish Americans have served with distinction in every war this Nation has fought; and
- WHEREAS: Today Irish tradition is found throughout our culture, as a steady migration from northern Irish cities has brought thousands of Irish to Georgia; and
- WHEREAS: For centuries Georgia has welcomed its Irish population, and today almost 40 percent of Georgians and 1 million Atlantans claim Irish heritage; and
- WHEREAS: In 2006 Atlanta will host the 125th annual St. Patrick's Parade, benefiting children's charities through the Atlanta St. Patrick's Day Foundation; now
- THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim March 2006 as IRISH HISTORY MONTH and encourage Georgians to celebrate the culture and traditions of Ireland.
