

AIR QUALITY AWARENESS WEEK

WHEREAS: Poor air quality affects the environment, the economy and the health of all Georgians; and

WHEREAS: Ground-level ozone damages plant life, reduces crop production and has other adverse environmental effects; and

WHEREAS: Emissions from mobile sources, such as cars and trucks, contribute to the creation of ground-level ozone and smog; and

WHEREAS: The summer months bring a higher incidence of days when ozone pollution and smog levels pose a risk to Georgia citizens and the environment; and

WHEREAS: The Clean Air Campaign is a regional effort that provides air quality education and recruits employers to enlist their help in encouraging employees to take actions to help reduce air pollution; now

THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 27-May 3, 2003, as AIR QUALITY AWARENESS WEEK in Georgia and call this observance to the attention of our citizens.
