- WHEREAS: Distinguished members of our community seek to increase our citizens' awareness of our state's archaeological history as a means to protect and preserve these irreplaceable links to our past; and
- WHEREAS: Georgia Archaeology Awareness Month offers Georgians an opportunity to "Discover the 13th Colony;" now
- THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2003 as ARCHAEOLOGY MONTH in Georgia.
