## DIA DE LA MUJER LATINA

- WHEREAS: Since 1997, Día de la Mujer Latina, a unique and culturally sensative health project, has achieved tremendous success because of its partnership with the American Cancer Society, the Mexican Consulate and local Latino-based organizations, hospitals and county clinics, in an effort to eliminate health disparity among our ethnic groups; and
- WHEREAS: This daylong health festival is widely anticipated by our Latino community, and we have succeeded in eliminating some of the cultural and systemic barriers to access to care within this population-at-risk; and
- WHEREAS: Día de la Mujer Latina provides a culturally appropriate setting for Latinas to receive free or low-cost breast and cervical cancer education and screening, HIV testing, vision testing, sexually transmitted disease testing, diabetes screening and pregnancy tests, in addition to domestic violence education; and
- WHEREAS: Ethnic-specific education and awareness are critical in the prevention and treatment of illness and disease; and
- WHEREAS: In addition to women's health, Día de la Mujer Latina provides immunizations for children, prostate cancer screening for men and colorectal cancer screening for men and women; and.
- THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 3, 2003, as DIA DE LA MUJER LATINA in Georgia.
