## DAY OF FAITH

- WHEREAS: We have enjoyed a history of economic growth and vitality in our country; yet, many of our citizens have not fully shared in our nation's prosperity. In response, Georgia citizens, families and communities remain committed to aiding their fellow man in battling social distress; and
- WHEREAS: Faith-based organizations in Georgia are critical to meeting the needs of our citizens and communities, from feeding the hungry to sheltering the homeless, from training the unemployed to educating our youth; and
- WHEREAS: Faith-based initiatives and collaboratives have brought economic vitality to underserved neighborhoods and communities, often through partnerships with businesses and local and state governments; and
- WHEREAS: The State of Georgia seeks to expand its partnership with faith-based initiatives and organizations in fulfilling the federal law of "Charitable Choice" and supports the Georgia Faith-Based Initiative Task Force of legislators, spiritual leaders, community activists and business leaders, to ensure that fairness exists for faith-based organizations seeking equal access to government funding as they attempt to better serve our communities; and
- WHEREAS: By complying with the federal mandate, Georgia faith-based organizations can serve all members of the public without regard to their religious beliefs, offering social services to our communities in a choice of settings in which to provide needed help using state funds; now
- THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim March 6, 2003, as a **DAY OF FAITH** in Georgia.
