WHEREAS: Emus are members of the ratite family, which includes ostrich, rhea,

cassowary and kiwi. Originally from Australia, these birds are very

useful for their meat, oil, hide, feathers and eggs; and

WHEREAS: Medical studies have shown that emu oil offers burn victims hope in

the battle to promote new skin growth and can lessen the extent of prolonged and painful traditional treatments of skin scraping and

skin grafting; and

WHEREAS: The emu is environmentally friendly to raise, and its unique low-fat

meat is similar in taste and texture to lean beef. Recognized by the American heart Association as a healthy red meat, Emu meat is free

from growth hormones and antibiotics; now

THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby

proclaim May 3-11, 2003, as EMU WEEK IN GEORGIA and call this

observance to the attention of our citizens.
