FETAL ALCOHOL SYNDROME AWARENESS DAY

- WHEREAS: Fetal Alcohol Syndrome (FAS) is a pattern of mental and physical abnormalities that develop in some babies when the mother drinks alcohol during pregnancy; and
- WHEREAS: Alcohol in a pregnant woman's bloodstream circulates to the fetus by crossing the placenta, where the alcohol interferes with the ability of the fetus to receive sufficient oxygen and nourishment for normal cell development in the brain and other body organs; and
- WHEREAS: FAS symptoms include growth deficiencies, skeletal and/or organ deformities, facial abnormalities and central nervous system handicaps.Maternal alcohol use is the leading known cause of mental retardation in the western world; and
- WHEREAS: Each year more than 50,000 babies are born with some degree of alcoholrelated damage. FAS is one of the major root causes of learning disabilities, early school drop-out, juvenile delinquency, drug addiction, alcoholism, mental illness, crime and domestic abuse; now
- THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 9, 2003, as FETAL ALCOHOL SYNDROME AWARENESS DAY in Georgia and urge all citizens to act responsibly in preventing FAS in their children.
