OSTEOPOROSIS MONTH

- WHEREAS: Osteoporosis is a silent disease of epidemic proportions characterized by debilitating and costly bone loss that is affecting Georgians, especially women, at an unprecedented rate; and
- WHEREAS: Three of every four women aged 65 and older have osteoporosis or low bone mass, yet fewer than one in ten received a Medicarereimbursed bone density test in 2001. More than 1.08 million Georgians were estimated to have osteoporosis in 2002, with prevalence expected to grow 54 percent b 1.67 million by 2020 throughout Georgia; and
- WHEREAS: Women with osteoporosis are at high risk for bone fracture, with 35 percent of those hospitalized in Georgia for osteoporotic fractures being discharged to long-term care facilities at a great cost to our citizens; and
- WHEREAS: During the month of May, both women and men are encouraged to fight osteoporosis by staying active, knowing their risks and understanding the treatment options that help prevent fractures; and
- THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2003 as OSTEOPOROSIS MONTH throughout Georgia.
