WHEREAS: It is fitting and appropriate that our citizens join with the Saint David's

Welsh Society of Georgia in celebrating the cultural heritage of these proud

Celtic people and their contributions to our State; now

THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

March 1, 2003, as SAINT DAVID'S DAY in Georgia in honor of the patron saint of Wales and in tribute to the accomplishments of Welsh Americans.
