

THE CITY OF OAKWOOD 100th ANNIVERSARY

WHEREAS: Georgians take pride in celebrating their traditions and heritage--among these, growth, rebirth and preservation of the history of our towns and cities; and

WHEREAS: The City of Oakwood, home of Georgia's first school bus, will mark the 100th anniversary of its founding with the dedication of the City Hall building; and

WHEREAS: Oakwood was founded in North Georgia on August 3, 1903, with a population of 250; and

WHEREAS: Oakwood has always been a place that fondly treasures its role in Georgia history but remains focused on the bright future ahead. As a result, the centennial celebration will recognize both the past and the future of the community; and

THEREFORE: I, SONNY PERDUE, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby recognize Oakwood, Georgia, August 3, 2003, on the occasion of its 100th anniversary year and call the observance to the attention of our citizens.
