Georgia Emergency Management Agency – To provide funds of \$27,348,390 to cover costs associated with the following declared disasters:

On March 27, 2009, severe weather began to affect the State of Georgia, causing torrential downpours and severe thunderstorms, resulting in flooding in the following counties: Atkinson, Baker, Ben Hill, Berrien, Brooks, Calhoun, Coffee, Colquitt, Decatur, Early, Lowndes, Miller, Mitchell, Tift, Turner, and Worth. Rivers continued to rise, overflowing their banks, and severe thunderstorms continued exacerbating downstream flooding in Appling, Bacon, Brantley, Clinch, Cook, Crisp, Dodge, Dougherty, Echols, Grady, Irwin, Jeff Davis, Lanier, Lee, McIntosh, Monroe, Montgomery, Pierce, Pulaski, Seminole, Tattnall, Telfair, Thomas, Toombs, Upson, Ware, Wayne, Wheeler, and Wilcox Counties.

The anticipated remaining State match for disaster recovery for the declared counties is \$5,178,235. FEMA will contribute approximately \$24,206,372.

On September 18, 2009, severe weather resulted in excessive rain caused extensive flooding in the following counties: Carroll, Catoosa, Chattooga, Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, Crawford, DeKalb, Douglas, Forsyth, Fulton, Gwinnett, Newton, Paulding, Stephens and Walker counties.

The anticipated State match needed for the disaster recovery for the declared counties is \$22,170,155. FEMA will contribute approximately \$217,755,080. Local county share cost is estimated to be \$28,571,273.
