EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: On May 11, 2008, a severe weather system moved into the State of Georgia producing severe thunderstorms resulting in excessive rain, hail and tornadoes which caused extensive damage in Bibb, Carroll, Douglas, Jefferson, Johnson, and Laurens Counties; and

WHEREAS: The assistance of the government of the State of Georgia is necessary to protect the public health, preserve the public safety, keep property damage to a minimum and restore the social and economic welfare of these counties; and

WHEREAS: In light of these circumstances the exercise of the authority vested in the Governor pursuant to Article 3, Section 38-3-51, of the Georgia Emergency Management Act of 1981, as amended is warranted to issue reasonable orders, rules and regulations as are deemed necessary to preserve public health, safety and welfare, and to bring the emergency situation under control within the acknowledged limitations of the powers of the Governor.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That a State of Emergency exists in Bibb, Carroll, Douglas, Jefferson, Johnson, and Laurens Counties.

IT IS FURTHER

ORDERED: That personnel and equipment resources of the State of Georgia be made available to assist in the response and recovery activities currently being undertaken in the above mentioned counties and that the Georgia Emergency Management Agency activate the Georgia Emergency Operations Plan.
