EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: The General Assembly passed, and I signed Senate Bill 82, which provides for a referendum that, if passed, incorporates the City of Dunwoody in DeKalb County; and

WHEREAS: The voters in the July 15 referendum voted overwhelmingly to create the City of Dunwoody; and

WHEREAS: An orderly and amicable transition is in the best interests of all residents of DeKalb County; and

WHEREAS: The Official Code of Georgia provides a statutory mechanism to assist with the transition, and the elected representatives of Dunwoody have requested a Governor's Commission on the City of Dunwoody;

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA AND BY SECTION 36-31-8(g) OF THE OFFICIAL CODE OF GEORGIA ANNOTATED, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That a Commission for Dunwoody be created to facilitate the provision of municipal services and facilities, the collection of taxes and fees, and the negotiation of intergovernmental agreements in preparation of the establishment of the new municipality. The Commission shall stand dissolved as of the time the members of the City Council of Dunwoody take office.

ORDERED: That the following persons are appointed to serve on the Commission: (1) Brian Anderson; (2) David Purcell; (3) Bill Robinson; (4) Yvonne Williams; and (5) Bev Wingate.
