EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

FLAGS ON STATE BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS ORDERED LOWERED TO HALF STAFF

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia mourns the loss of the Honorable

Griffin B. Bell, one of our nation's greatest public servants

and one of Georgia's most accomplished native sons; and

WHEREAS: As a highly respected counselor to political leaders on both

sides of the political spectrum, Judge Bell's impact on our

state and nation spanned multiple generations; and

WHEREAS: Judge Bell served as chief of staff to Georgia Governor S.

Ernest Vandiver; and

WHEREAS: Judge Bell rendered his country exemplary service as Judge

of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit;

and

WHEREAS: Judge Bell served with distinction as Attorney General of the

United States; and

WHEREAS: Judge Bell was subsequently called upon by numerous U.S.

Presidents to lend his country his considerable wisdom and expertise by serving in a variety of other leadership roles;

and

WHEREAS: Judge Bell was a pillar of the Georgia legal community as an

attorney in private practice first in Savannah at Lawton & Cunningham, then in Rome at Matthews, Owens & Maddox, and finally in Atlanta, where he spent forty years at King & Spalding, which under his leadership grew from an eminent

Atlanta law firm into a preeminent international law firm.

Now, therefore, in honor and as a mark of respect for the memory of the Honorable Griffin Bell and his family and friends, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Georgia, it is hereby

ORDERED:

That the flag of the United States and the flag of this State be flown at half-staff on all state buildings and grounds on Wednesday, January 7, 2009, the day of his funeral, until sunset.
