


State Revenues 1995-2006





Georgia's Population Growth






Enrollment Growth



K-12 Enrollment Growth






Medicaid Costs


Best Managed Percentage of State Funds Spent





Classroom Focus

65% Rule for Classroom Spending



- Requires that at least 65% of all education dollars be spent in the classroom instead of on administrative overhead.
- Systems can increase classroom spending 2% per year until reaching the 65% minimum.
- Systems already demonstrating high performance in the classroom can be waived from the minimum.


Teacher Pay



- 4% pay raise at minimum for all teachers (\$217 million)
- Over 50% of all teachers will get a 7% pay raise
- State will cover the entire increase of health care costs with no employee premiums. (\$138 million)




- Reduce and clarify individual maximum class sizes for grades K-8.






Classroom Construction & Bonds for Buses

Drop Out Prevention



- High School Completion Counselor for every high school (\$21 million in state funds) to target at-risk students.
- Middle school remediation (\$2.3 million) for 6th through 8th grade.
- Form a "career interest ladder" with postsecondary schools to help students understand how their classes relate to their future work.




Protecting HOPE

HOPE Chest Constitutional Amendment

- Constitutional amendment requiring that Lottery funds be used only for HOPE Scholarships and Pre-K.
- Saves any excess Lottery revenues for a "rainy day" reserve
- Stops spending unrelated to HOPE and Pre-K like the \$1.8 billion spent between 1994 and 2003.
